Award-Winning 11 Year Old Actress Gracyn Shinyei Talks About Success

Vancouver, BC - Gracyn Shinyei is an 11 year old triple threat performer with multiple credits in event hosting and Film/TV. She started her acting path appearing in numerous US National commercials at age 4 then proceeded into film and TV projects. Steady TV work has her continuing her lead roles in the Hallmark front runner TV series: "When Calls the Heart" playing "Emily Montgomery" (currently in its 5th season) and Amazon's premiere series: "The Man in the High Castle" playing "Amy Smith" (currently in its 3rd season). Gracyn played the iconic evil younger version of "The Darkness" in "Supernatural" and has done a few Movies for TV on several networks. In 2013, 2014 and 2015 she has won the Joey Awards for TV series drama in a leading role.

We interviewed Gracyn to discover her showbiz tips and what keeps her going.

What made you decide on acting?

My older brother had always took acting and he liked it. I tried it and I loved it.

Did you have any training or experience before your first role? No I didn't.

What is your acting specialty?

I started when I was four years old with TV and voice-over. My first international TV commercial was a cookie commercial.

Who do you look to as a teacher or mentor in the showbiz industry?

Even though he has no experience in the industry, it would be my Dad. He teaches me and has great tips for me.

What success tips would you offer a young person that would like to do what you are doing?

Don't stress out about anything and stay calm. Be confident in what you're doing. Stay focused on what you're learning or doing like learning scripts and lines.

What is the hardest part of your acting?

Learning lines. Somedays I get one day to learn a big page script. You need to know every word. Sometimes I have 3 days to memorize lines.

What other skills do you have to help you out in showbiz?

Well, I'm a dancer and take tap, jazz, ballet, hip-hop, lyrical, acro, song & dance. I dance 6 days a week.

What's the easiest part of the business?

Standing around waiting to rehearse and perform my lines.

What does success mean to you?

You need to work really hard and be confident. Use all your power to get success.

What do you value most and want more than anything?

To be happy because it makes things better and I feel good about myself.

Do you have a favorite quote or saying that you live by?

Yes. A quote from Disney's movie Lilo & Stich. "Ohana means family, family means no one gets left behind or forgotten.

What motivates you to get up in the morning?

I like to get up and get things done, do homework, clean my room, so I can have time for more fun!
